Overall project background	In response to the refugee crises, the European Union (EU) through its Regional Trust Fund in Response to the Syrian crisis, or the 'Madad Fund' provides funding to 2 projects; namely the 'Municipal Empowerment and Resilience Project' (MERF and 'Maintaining Strength and Resilience for Local Governments Project' (MASAR) These two projects take similar approaches in strengthening the resilience of Lebanese municipalities and Union of Municipalities (UoM) and host and displace populations. MERP is a joint initiative by the United Nations Development Programme (UNDF and the United Nations Human Settlement Programme (UN-Habitat). The project i implemented in partnership with the Ministry of Interior and Municipalities (MoIM).		
	MASAR for Local Governments is a programme with an overall aim to strengthe the long-term resilience of targeted subnational governments and their host, refuge and IDP populations to deal with displacement.		
	In Lebanon , the programme aims to help governorates of Baalbek-Hermel, Akkar coastal plain north of Tripoli and their unions of municipalities to deal wit accelerated urbanisation caused by the crisis. MASAR has three objectives:		
	 To improve the capacities of subnational governments to engage in holistic area-based planning and consider different scenarios that respond to the needs of host, refugee and IDP populations. 		
	• To improve service delivery in order to generate greater social stabilit outcomes based on the needs of host, refugee and IDP populations.		
	• To empower subnational governments and service providers in facilitating local economic development and in having better access to municipal investments that benefit the extension of safe public services and creat economic opportunities for host, refugee and IDP populations.		
	This programme mobilises municipal experts from Lebanon and Europe to assist their Iraqi and Lebanese colleagues. This involves overall advice/technical input training, coaching, and mentoring in planning units or service departments, mixed with implementation of pilot projects in the identified area of intervention.		



Aim of this assignment	To build on the gains and achievements of MASAR and MERP, it is deemed necessary to further develop and build the necessary skills allowing municipalities and Unions of Municipalities (UoMs) to function even after the projects have ceased their assistance (1 December 2022).			
	MERP, in close collaboration with and technical input from MASAR will develop at roll-out training modules in their target areas that aim to strengthen core municip skills required to weather the challenging political and socio-economic context. To overall goal of the Municipal Training Curriculum is to support UoMs at municipalities <i>build a robust understanding and knowledge in the interrelated topi</i> <i>of: area-based strategic planning, geographical information systems and propos</i> <i>writing.</i> This process is best supported through <i>a multi-stakeholder planning proce</i> with sufficient flexibility allowing to address territorial problems, overcom challenges and seize opportunities.			
	To assist municipalities and UoMs, MERP, in close collaboration with the technical input from MASAR <i>will develop and roll-out training modules that aim to strengthen core municipal skills</i> that include the following core training modules:			
	 Area-based Strategic Planning & Economic Development: providing the basic skills to plan and manage the multi-stakeholder process towards resilient and improved services and infrastructure; GIS supported service delivery planning, operations & management: explaining the importance, minimum functionality data requirements, and milestones towards a Geographical Information System (GIS) to support evidence-based policymaking and service management; and Proposal writing: developing the skills to write proposals providing access to external funding opportunities. 			
	 The overall aims of the Municipal Service curriculum delivery are: To equip Unions of Municipalities, Municipalities with essential knowledge, different approaches and corresponding skills that enable them to mitigate – to some extent - the impact of the combined macroeconomic, fiscal and financial crisis and thereby serving their communities better. To sustain this intervention on the longer term through the institutional institution of the developed curriculum approaches. 			
	institutionalization of the developed curriculum, coaching and process facilitation in each projects' areas of intervention.			
	This is done through close engagement with the Directorate General of Local Administrations and Councils (DGLAC), the Regional Technical Offices (RTOs), and hands-on support to Unions and municipalities by MERP /MASAR.

	 Ad 2: Assist in the introduction and roll-out of the training modules/ Training of Trainers toolkit by way of: Supporting the trainer of Trainers to the selected pool of the DGLAC/UoMs/Regional Technical Officers/ knowledge providers/Thematic Coordinators providing relevant international input and expertise (Mission1: 5 days). Assist the DGLAC/UoM/MASAR Thematic Coordinators in the rollout of the Unions/Municipalities on the training manuals & toolkit in MASAR areas of intervention; Technically support ToT trainees from DGLAC/UoMs/RTOS/MASAR Thematic Coordinators in the rollout of workshops in MASAR geographical areas of intervention. These workshops will aim at training municipalities on the developed training material, with the active participation of civil society, MASAR, etc. (Mission 2: 10 days).
